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

NI Peatland Strategy Update

- Ongoing consultation on Equality Impact Assessment ends 4th November
- Aim to publish Peatland Strategy towards end of 2022
- Peatland Strategy commits us to taking forward the CCC recommendations
 - ❖ 150,000 ha by 2050
 - ❖ 7,500 ha per year until 2035






Climate Change Act (Northern Ireland) 2022

- Net Zero Greenhouse Gas Emissions reduction target by 2050
- Interim target of at least 48% lower than the baseline by 2030

- Key delivery vehicle for meeting carbon budgets
- First 5-year plan by the end of 2023
- Will include:
 - policies and proposals from all NI departments
 - > annual GHG and air quality targets
 - soil quality and biodiversity targets
 - desirability of using nature-based projects
 - Just Transition


Aim: Moving from a high to a low greenhouse gas emissions economy

Soil Nutrient Health Scheme



- Innovative scheme rolling out to farms across NI over the next four years. Budget of up to £45m
- Aims to verifiably establish baselines of:
 - Key soil nutrients at individual field level
 - Carbon stock estimates in soils and AGB (primarily hedgerows & trees)
- LiDAR scan of the entire land area of NI will be carried out to assist in:
 - The hydrological mapping of NI's water catchments
 - The estimation of Above Ground Biomass carbon stocks





Concluding Projects 2022

Collaborative Action for the Natura Network (CANN)



- 13 SAC habitat maps produced
- 12 draft SAC Management Plans
- Conservation actions on approx. 2500ha which includes peatland and wetland habitats

Co-operation Across Borders for Biodiversity (CABB)



- 3 SAC habitat maps produced
- 3 draft SAC Management Plans
- Conservation actions on approx. 500ha which includes peatland and wetland habitats.









145 cell bunds (6 ha)
237 peat dams inserted every 10-12m (16 ha)

Restoration of over 20 hectares of peatbog that was previously planted with Lodgepole pine using a new method for formerly afforested areas called cell bunding as well as drain blocking with peat dams on the site. Also trialled *Sphagnum* seeding on 1 Ha. of cell bunds.

Future and ongoing projects

- Development of restoration opportunity maps for peatland restoration in N.I. Phase II delivery March 2023 (UW/JHI)
- NI Peat Flux Network 4 Eddy-Covariance flux towers, establishing a monitoring network across a gradient
 of peatland condition and management conditions specific to NI peatlands (CEH)
- Exploration of the application of the Peatland Code in N.I. (RSPB)
- Enhancing Peatland Habitat Management and Skills The Conservation Volunteers (TCV)
- Habitat Restoration, development of managements plans, scoping future projects and capacity building (Mid and East Antrim Borough Council, and UW)






Conservation Management Plans

- Suite of CMPs being developed for freshwater, terrestrial & marine SACs including peatland SACs
- Plans have defined necessary conservation measures for peatland sites including appropriate drain blocking, scrub and invasive species clearance, appropriate grazing regimes and addressing other pressures and threats.
- Majority of CMPs are due to be completed Dec 2022
- Partnership development and delivery mechanisms being further explored.
- Peace Plus proposals well developed, building on INTERREG opening in 2023 (tbc)





Living Map of Northern Ireland – Next Steps – Asset register

- Land cover/habitat classification map of NI 1st Iteration –
 Autumn 2022
- Analysis across 4 broad geological zones
- Continued ground-truthing NIEA habitat surveys &
 Northern Ireland Countryside Survey 2022
- Assessment of bare peatland areas as a measure of condition
- Further development planned including updating EO data and introducing further habitat classifications to reflect the wider countryside
- Link into Nature Recovery Network and 30x30 scenarios





Horticulture at College of Agriculture, Food and Rural Enterprise

Research into the peat free alternatives for use in recreational and commercial horticulture

- Development of peat free media for use in the production of herbaceous perennials
- 2. Peat free media for plant bedding, hardy ornamental nursery stock and protected ornamental species.
- 3. Assessment of performance of edible crops.







Wildfires in Northern Ireland A Strategic Way Forward

- NI Strategic Wildfire Group established
- NI Wildfire Stakeholders Forum established
- Wildfire Strategy being finalised with public consultation in the near future
- Development of the strategic action plan is ongoing.
- Fleet of specialist wildfire response vehicles is in joint service with NIEA and NIFRS - designed to access hard to reach areas including peatland areas.
- UK Wildfire Conference The Human Dimension, 9-10th November







Current Funding

Environmental Farming Scheme (EFS) 2017 – Present

- Supports remediation of peatland habitats grazing, scrub removal
- Just under 5500 participants (1/5th of farm businesses)
- Delivered remedial management on 29,000 ha of peatland
- Continued piloting of group scheme Carn Glenshane SAC

Environment Fund

- Current business case concludes April 2023
- Challenge Fund strand 2022/23 has offered £3.4m to date to deliver key environmental outcomes across Northern Ireland.
- £500,000 has been awarded for peatland habitat restoration, development of management plans, capacity building and private finance scoping.





Future Funding

DAERA Environment Fund

- Launch of Environment Fund competition (2023/24 2027/28) which will allocate in the region of £100million of funding through the 3 strands of the Environment Fund during the next 5 years.
- Objectives are to work with not-for-profit voluntary sector and district council partners to deliver key environmental outcomes including the protection, improvement and monitoring of habitats and species

PEACE PLUS

- Investment area 5.1 Biodiversity, Nature Recovery & Resilience - €40Million budget
- Habitat and species restoration focus on wetland habitat and species is a key area of joint working with ROI counterparts
- Continued focus on and roll out implementation of management plans developed under INTERREG VA.





Future Funding

Green Growth Capital Investment Programme

- Up to £700m of potential support for a range of projects over the next 5 years.
- Projects will contribute to the achievement of Green Growth objectives.
- Up to £60m of GGCIP funding identified to support DAERA's work in restoring natural habitats, including peatlands (subject to available budget).

Shared Island Fund

- Irish Government has committed €1 billion euro to be spent by 2025.
- Will support a wide range of cross-Border co-operation projects, including joined up approaches to climate action and biodiversity projects.
- Smaller scale projects could be awarded up to €100,000 per year for up to two years, while larger projects between could get up to €1m each year for four years.
